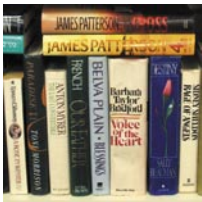

business giant Lab Corp was founded, the city of Burlington adopted its very first zoning ordinance, Burlington City



Schools received a federal desegregation order to eliminate racial segregation in it's schools, Alamance County became the first county in NC to establish a Parks & Recreation Department, Governor Robert Scott and Mrs Elizabeth Carrington donated 48 acres of land to the Technical Institute of Alamance to build the new buildings & campus that later became Alamance Community College, and Cummings High School completed construction and became a fully operational school. And what else happened in 1971 that should be highlighted? The Humane Society of Alamance County was formed!

This year we celebrate our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary and firmly establish ourselves as one of the

granddaddy organizations in Alamance County. Many non-profits and charitable organizations have come and gone, but HSAC has proven itself to be a solid, worthy, valuable group and continues to thrive, even in these tough



economic times. Sure, there may be nay-sayers who point to volunteer organizations and opine about how volunteer groups aren't reliable and can't last, but to them we can proudly say: 40 years and going strong!

I had a great time last evening diving into newsletters dating back to the Winter of '99. I wish I had earlier editions because I learned so much about how we've grown and about the wonderful volunteers that have worked hard for us. Some of the volunteers have moved away, some have passed away. We appreciate and honor all the good-hearted people who

have helped our cause over the years. Many of our original volunteers have inspired their own children to become active in the Humane Society. We love the idea that another generation is coming along to help HSAC

move forward, to grow and to become even stronger than it already is! I learned many things reading those old newsletters. For instance, I read about the



beginnings of our spay/neuter program in 1988, when two dedicated women would meet pet-owners in the parking lot of K-Mart (currently Granddaddy's on Maple Ave.) and would drive the animals in their personal cars to Staley NC so that low-income Alamance County citizens could benefit from low-cost options for their pets. Today, the majority of our county's veterinary hospitals now participate in our low-cost spay/neuter program so surgeries are now performed locally. Thank you Vets!

Also in an early edition I read an article by our first Administrative Assistant who was proudly announcing



that she'd received 88 calls for assistance that particular month, making that a high for her. Today, our office regularly receives 500-750 calls & e-mails



each month from our community who are looking for help, advice or who themselves are helping us help the animals. We also are able to reach out to people through social media and other electronic means that weren't available to us back in the day.

I also found an article by another HSAC volunteer who was proposing a foster program for the very first time and was looking for supporters. Hooray to these people who came together and developed a



program that has resulted in countless animals being rescued and



rehomed because of HSAC efforts rather than being surrendered to the city animal shelter.

So this year we celebrate the Humane Society of Alamance County's 40th anniversary. We celebrate our volunteers-both

## Larsons Unite Renters and Pets

decided to follow their hearts and open the *only* property management company in this area that caters to pets.



June and Chuck Larson of Larson Property Management.

In her own words, June Larson explained how her business plan differs from other property management companies: "When we decided that we wanted to actively pursue doing property management on a full-time basis, with our own company, we wanted to be known for some basic principles. First of all, we didn't want to rent out any home that wasn't clean enough, or in a safe enough area that we wouldn't live in it ourselves. And secondly, if the owners of the property were not willing to allow tenants to bring their pets with them, we would not manage the properties. Period." Sometimes owners will ask June

if they can just stipulate 'no cats' to which June will reply, "Sorry, we can't discriminate."

The Larsons believe strongly that the only answer to animal overpopulation and homelessness is spaying and neutering. The Larson Property Management lease requires that all pets must be spayed and neutered and up to date on their vaccinations. Larson Property Management requires a copy of veterinary records upon move-in. And animals are NEVER allowed to be on chains. The Larsons work hard to place pets and their owners in the right rental space, considering the size and other needs of the animal(s). June checks up on her rental tenants to make sure that the animals are being treated properly. Larson Property Management does not charge a pet deposit. As stated in their

pet rules, their primary desire is to promote and insure the wellbeing of any animals kept on the properties they manage.

June & Chuck consider their own animals to be a cherished part of their family.

As June explained "We would not consider asking someone to 'get rid of their children'; so why would we ask them to 'get rid of their pet?' We do not view animals as a possession to be bought or sold or disposed of. When owners point to damages they have experienced in the past, we try to educate

them to the fact that it is the people that we indeed have to screen most carefully, and not the animals. We have yet to ever have a dog break a lease! We point out that if a human were placed in a home and left from 7 am until 6 pm in the evening and told not to go to the bathroom, they would probably be incapable of doing so. And yet sometimes we humans ask animals to do just that."

As June says, "We realize that we can't change the world, and we can't re-write the laws of Alamance County; but we can exert our influence on a part of it - and we hope that in doing so, perhaps we can make a difference."

of clumping cat litter, 5 pounds of dog treats and \$70.00 in cash donations!

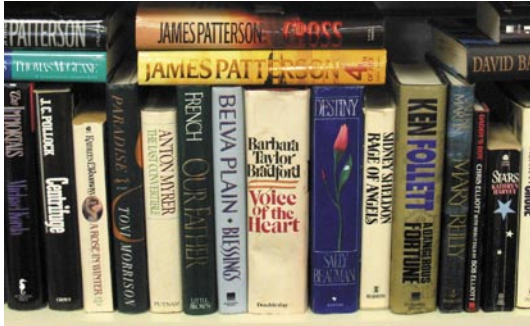
